## FROM FATHER JOHN

In Isaiah 61 and Luke 4, we hear mentioned 'A Year of Favor From the Lord.' In ancient Israel, the practice of celebrating a Jubilee year was very important. Every 50 years the Israelites would celebrate this Jubilee by letting the land rest, letting slaves go free and returning land to its rightful owner. It was a way in which Israel attempted to keep themselves free of slavery and free of debt. More importantly, it was a way in which they recognized God's sovereignty and benevolence toward them.

In light of this, I think we Americans need a special year for ourselves. Not necessarily a year of favor from the Lord, but a year free of electronic media. Over the course of my life, I have witnessed the ever-coarsening effect that electronic media is having on us. It is my belief that the more time we spend in front of our televisions, our phones and our computers, the narrower and more corrupted our thinking gets, and the less able we are to simply get along with other people, especially those different from us.

The great promise of the internet and portable communication was 'connectedness.' Proponents of electronic media told us over and over again that these devices and the information/resources they conveyed would 'bring us together' and 'keep us in touch' and 'expand our knowledge of the world around us.' And in some ways, they have. For example, just the other night I chatted on Facebook with several old Army friends that I had not heard from in over 30 years. It was great!

However, it is becoming clear to me that electronic media is doing us more harm than good. Increasingly we are living isolated lives, just us and our devices, devoid of the real face-to-face human contact that God designed us for. Increasingly we are living in 'echo-chambers' where that only information we absorb is information we already agree with. This isn't good. It's not good at all.

On Mondays, I'm usually on the water fishing. However, it's not the fishing that makes that one day most enjoyable. What makes that one day special is that I get away from my TV, my computer and my phone. And life becomes livable again. You all should try it!
